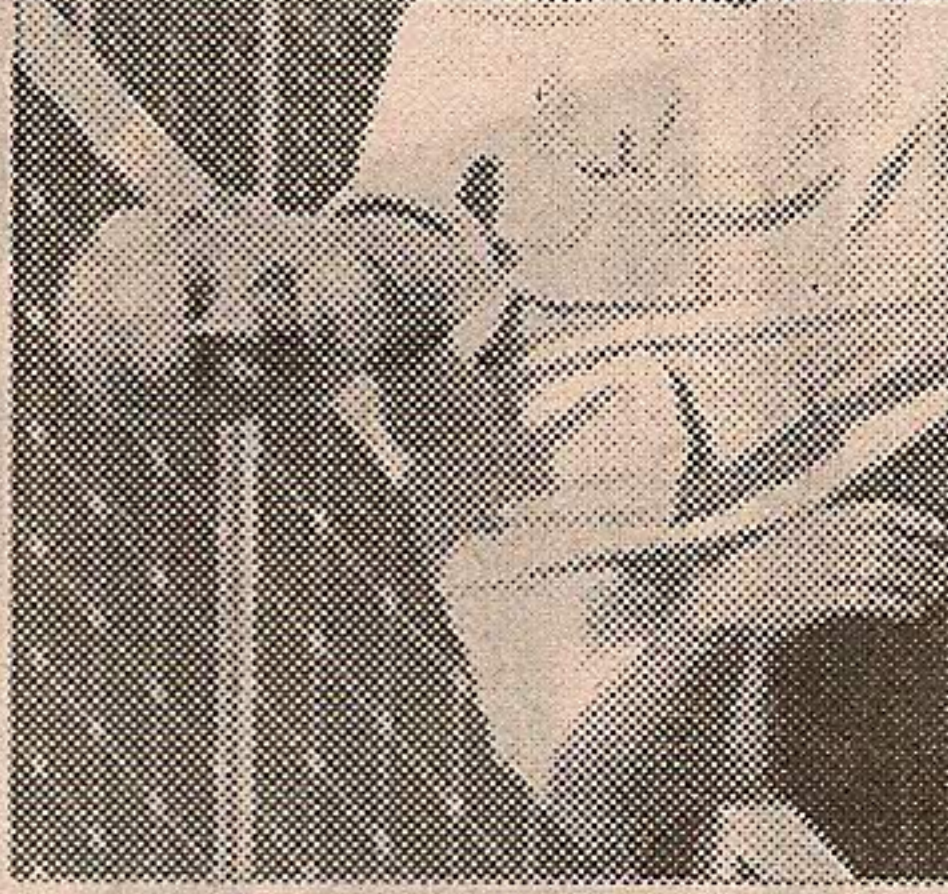
This may sound crazy to some but why not put the "power" back in the hands of the people!
